### LEARNING OUTCOMES

The European Master's degree program in Physical Activity and Health is an inter-university course offered jointly by five European universities on the basis of bilateral agreements signed by the referent persons of the respective universities: the University of Rome "Foro Italico", the University of Vienna, the Norwegian School of Sport Sciences, the University of Southern Denmark and the German Sport University. In three of the above mentioned universities (University of Rome "Foro Italico", University of Vienna, Norwegian School of Sport Science in Oslo) the program has been accredited since 2010 and regularly included in their respective Academic Offers. It aims to upgrade graduates into specialists in preventive and adapted physical activities while the bilateral agreements in force guarantee at the end of the course of study, awarding of a joint certificate which recognizes the entire educational process and, depending on the individual curriculum, the single or double national degree.

Taking into account the development needs expressed by society and the European context, and making use of broad interdisciplinary European synergies, this specialization requires a high-level integration of knowledge and skills in sport sciences, with related biomedical, psycho-pedagogical and sociological knowledge and skills pertaining to the use of sport sciences in preventive and rehabilitative settings, considering specific aspects of the target populations, such as socio-cultural, environmental, economic, health statuses and socio-anagraphical specifications, including age and gender.

Originally developed within the framework of the M.D. 270/2004, and in line with the reform of the M.D. 1649/2023, the course pursues the objectives that favour the convergence of European Higher Education systems and the realization of a European Higher Education Area, taking into account and constantly updating the development needs expressed by society and the European reference context, consistent with the strategic planning and available resources of the various European partner universities and in compliance with the European Standards and Guidelines for Quality Assurance (EHEA).

All educational activities of the Master's Degree Course are offered in English (teaching, tutoring, assessments/exams, essay, thesis and final paper defence). The maximum number of curricular courses is eight (8), four in the first year (60 ECTS, compulsory) and from two to four in the second year (30 ECTS, student's choice). The Course benefits from an international faculty for both the first-year courses, which take place in Rome, and the second-year courses, which take place at all partner universities, where there are mandatory periods of study abroad, thus fostering exposure to an international context from the outset as well as actual student mobility.

The learning unit, to which several disciplinary areas contribute, focuses on the development of knowledge and skills through which the student, through a pathway that encourages the critical investigation of topics carried out in an autonomous and interdisciplinary manner, can achieve the specific training objective that ensures the acquisition of advanced knowledge and skills that enable the design, development and management of physical activity and sports programs:

- aimed at contributing to physical efficiency (Fitness) and a person's sense of well-being (Wellness), individual and collective health, and the prevention of risk factors, with particular regard to those related to chronic diseases;
- that are part of the rehabilitation chain, in cardiovascular, orthopedic, trauma, neurological, etc.;
- directed to populations of different age groups, through specialization in motor work with children, adults and the elderly;
- directed to populations with different disabilities.

Graduates will also need to be able to perform the above activities with complete autonomy and will need to develop the skills to increase and maintain motivation for participation in physical activity in different populations and conditions. They will need to be able to perform diagnostic screening aimed at calibrating and personalizing motor and sports activity programs and then monitor their execution. Finally, they should be able to use scientific methodology for promotion and development in the area of physical activity and health.

### **EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES**

Based on M.D. 1649 and L.D. 28/02/2021, Master's graduates in Physical Activity and Health will be able to find employment as a **Kinesiologist of Preventive and Adapted Physical Activities**, for the provision of both group and individual physical activity or adapted sports programs at institutions, associations and sports clubs, sports centers and facilities, gyms, or even outdoors in trails and parks. Graduates may also be able to work in the field of teaching, cultural education and outreach; they may also work at centers for the recovery of at-risk individuals and social inclusion.

As a **Preventive and Adapted Motor Activities Kinesiologist**, professional activity requires that graduates in the master's degree programs of the class must be able, with broad decision-making powers and autonomy, to use advanced cultural, methodological and technical-practical tools necessary for:

- the design and implementation of movement activity programs aimed at achieving, recovering and maintaining the best conditions of psychophysical well-being for subjects in various age groups and in different physical conditions, with attention to gender specificities;
- the organization and planning of particular activities and lifestyles useful for the prevention of diseases and improvement of the quality of life through exercise;
- the prevention of postural issues and post-rehabilitation movement recovery aimed at maintaining physical efficiency;
- the planning, coordination and evaluation of adapted motor activities for people with disabilities or individuals with clinically controlled and stabilized health conditions.

Graduates must also acquire in-depth knowledge of the modifications and functional adaptations resulting from exercise; methods of assessing the state of physical efficiency and exercise programming, both for healthy individuals and for individuals with disabilities or with stabilized functional limitations of various kinds, resulting from pathologies that can benefit from exercise; and educational, communicative and psycho-motor methodologies and techniques aimed at those who exercise. They must also possess in-depth knowledge of the English language.

### COURSE STRUCTURE AND DURATION

The European Master of Science in Health and Physical Activity is a two-year program. English is the official language. Learning activities are organized in intensive teaching modules (3 weeks each). **For each module, attendance is expected to be no less than 90% of the teaching hours delivered.** The 4 modules of the first year will take place in Rome, at the University of Rome “Foro Italico”. **Students from consortium Universities can earn at their own home institution those credits relevant to topics of Research Methodology (Integrated Research Methodology in Sport Sciences), for a total of 15 ECTS.** The activities of the second year will take place in different partner or associated universities. At the end of the program a joint certificate together with single or double degree/s will be released, in compliance with partner University’s enrolment and ECTS requirements.

### ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Admission of candidates, set at 38 positions, is made according to the ranking order. 16 positions are reserved to students from partner universities (minimum 3/university, until reserved positions are taken up).

Candidates are eligible to apply if:

1. they hold one of the following qualifications:

- a) at least 3 years (180 ECTS) undergraduate degree in sport science area awarded by a European University or equivalent degree released by non-European Universities;
- b) at least 3 years (180 ECTS) undergraduate degree in different areas or equivalent degree awarded by a non-European University.

2. They are going to obtain relevant qualification by 30 November 2025 and at the time of application have acquired at least 155 ECTS.

**A number of additional positions are made available for admission to the second-year for those students who hold a first-level degree in Sport Science corresponding to 240 ECTS, with at least 60 ECTS overlapping first-year learning activities of the European Master of Science in Health and Physical Activity. For the academic year 2025/2026 the number of positions is set at 2.**

Candidates holding a non-Italian degree achieved in one of the member states of the European Higher Education Area<sup>1</sup>, during the application for the Call, can upload the Diploma Supplement with the deadline of the Call. Alternatively, these candidates have to upload the “Annex A - Foreign Academic Title” together with copy of a valid ID document; in this case, the diploma supplement must be sent to the appropriate office ([segreteria.studenti@uniroma4.it](mailto:segreteria.studenti@uniroma4.it)) within 4 months from enrolment, otherwise the career will be blocked.

Candidates holding a non-Italian degree not achieved in one of the member states of the European Higher Education Area, during the application for the Call and within its deadline, can upload:

1. Degree certificate listing all passed exams, translated and authenticated in Italian;
2. Official proof of degree validity issued by the Italian Consulate in the country where the degree was conferred and it should be clearly stated that the degree is valid for the application for admission “in Loco” to the second-level course.

Or

3. Certificate of Comparability and Verification for academic recognition (Naric/Cimea);
4. “Annex A - Foreign Academic Title” filled in and signed, together with copy of a valid ID document. In this case, documentation as in points 1 and 2 should be sent to the appropriate office ([segreteria.studenti@uniroma4.it](mailto:segreteria.studenti@uniroma4.it)) within 4 months from enrolment, otherwise the career will be blocked.

Foreign students will not be asked to pass the Italian language test.

All documents shall be attached in electronic format (pdf) following relevant upload procedure of the system when filling in the application for the admission to the selection.

#### **REQUIRED BACKGROUND - MANDATORY CURRICULAR REQUIREMENTS**

To be admitted to the European Master of Science in Health and Physical Activity it is mandatory to have earned a minimum requirement of ECTS or equivalent university credits in the following areas:

- At least 12 ECTS in the biomedical area;
- At least 4 ECTS in the psychological – pedagogical – sociological areas;
- At least 12 ECTS in the physical education/ Sport/Movement sciences, and Kinesiology areas, with special regard to the basis of adapted and preventive physical activity

The undergraduate degree in the Sport Science area is the first-level qualification fully recognised. Other undergraduate degrees will be evaluated by the European Master Board to determine their consistency with

the learning outcomes of the study program. In order to determine the additional learning outcomes to be gained, candidates in possession of qualifications other than the undergraduate degree in the Sport Science area shall include in the application in electronic format (see *Dispatch of documents*) a self-certification of obtained degree and passed exams or a degree certificate indicating all passed exams. On the basis of fixed criteria, certified professional experience, competences and skills could be recognised as ECTS, by enclosing also these documents in electronic format.

The above-mentioned curricular requirements must be already possessed or acquired by the date of enrolment, also through specific study activities on the basis of the indications of the University professors in charge of indicated subjects, who will have to certify the possession of any skills acquired by the candidates. To this end, interested parties must contact the responsible person of the course or the Chairperson of the study program directly, after submitting the application for admission, as indicated below. A Commission appointed by the Board of Studies will proceed to verify the acquisition of any missing mandatory curricular requirements by **19 December 2025**.

### **SELECTION CRITERIA AND RANKING**

Selection will be carried out by the Consortium Evaluation Board, appointed by the partners at the various consortium head offices. Candidates from countries other than the consortium will be examined at the head office in Rome.

Selection process shall evaluate:

- Undergraduate degree qualifications;
- Basic knowledge of topics related to preventive and adapted physical activity;
- Candidate's motivation and skills;
- English proficiency (level B2/C1).

### **Ranking of Graduates**

Candidates are admitted according to their ranking order set by:

- a) evaluation of degree titles (up to 20 points);
- b) average exams mark related to the bachelor degree (up to 10 points);
- c) basic knowledge test (up to 10 points);
- d) interview (up to 15 points);
- e) additional educational and/or professional qualifications (up to 5 points).

Maximum score is equal to 60/60.

Candidates ranking in the first 38 positions will be admitted to the European Master of Science in Health and Physical Activity, provided that they hold the necessary requirements by the closing date for applications. In this respect, ranking is to be considered provisional. In the event of equal final mark, the younger candidate will have precedence.

Candidates that are going to obtain relevant qualification by 30 November 2025 will be admitted to the course under condition; in fact, by the above mentioned deadline, candidates shall provide the Student Office [segreteria.studenti@uniroma4.it](mailto:segreteria.studenti@uniroma4.it) and [concorsi.ammissione@uniroma4.it](mailto:concorsi.ammissione@uniroma4.it) with a self-certification indicating degree date and score.

In case of positions still available, the Examination Board reserves the right to open again registration closing date for admission.

In case of average exams mark not in thirtieths, during the application, please insert the average exams mark, minimal mark and maximal related the higher education where the title has been achieved. Reference will be made to the Cimea database and Erasmus+ program tables for conversion to thirtieths.

**c) Basic knowledge test: up to 10 points**

It will assess basic knowledge of topics (movement, biomedical, psycho-pedagogical and sociological sciences) related to science of preventive and adapted physical activity. This test will be done online on **21 July 2025**.

**d) Interview: up to 15 points**

The interview will evaluate candidate's motivation and his/her ability to discuss topics pertaining the course activities and its internationalization, his/her background and experience, as well as assess candidate's proficiency in English. The interview will be done on **23 and/or 24 July 2025**, also online for students not residing in one partner country or in case of justified reason.

Detailed information will be sent via email to each candidate admitted to the selection. Those who will not undergo the test or the interview at scheduled time will be considered dropouts for the admission in the ranking list.

**e) Educational and/or professional qualifications (elective): up to 5 points**

Only qualifications concerning learning outcomes specific to the degree class will be taken into consideration. In particular:

### DISPATCH OF DOCUMENTS

When filling in the application, the system allows enclosure in electronic format, through the option “Sfoglia” (browse), of documents saved in the pc or in other electronic devices, by uploading them. All documents must be in pdf format and candidates shall ensure that the application procedure has been successfully completed. No other methods for sending documents shall be accepted.

### HOW TO APPLY

The application to participate to the selection shall be presented no later than 17 July 2025 at 12.00 (Central European Summer Time):

a) non-Italian candidates from European partner universities shall present the application to the respective consortium head office ([www.europeanmasterhpa.eu](http://www.europeanmasterhpa.eu)) following local procedure. Once selected by the local Committee, they have to complete the online enrolment by **12 September 2025** by filling the electronic form available at the following link: <http://www.uniroma4.it> => User Icon on the top right => “Accesso Studenti e docenti”.

b) Italian candidates and those from non-consortium countries shall present their application on-line to the head office in Rome by filling in proper form following the link from our website: <http://www.uniroma4.it>, User Icon on the top right, click on “Accesso Studenti e docenti”. First, the candidate shall register to use the system by providing the personal data and then he/she shall take note or stamp the username and password assigned by the system in order to proceed towards next steps. From now on, the candidate will be able to enter the website to complete the application. After logging in, access “segreteria”, then “test di ammissione” and proceed with the enrolment. In this phase all required documents must be uploaded in pdf format. **Annex B is mandatory.** In case of no payment of the selection fee of € 60,00 (see next paragraph), candidates will be excluded from the selection process.

### SELECTION FEE

The selection fee for students applying to the University of Rome “Foro Italico” is € 60,00 and shall be paid by the selection deadline (**17 July 2025**) as follow:

- **Italian students** have to utilize the electronic PagoPA form automatically generated by the system. If you wish to make the payment at a later date, but still by the deadline of 10 July 2024, click on the “Accesso studenti e docenti” item, User icon on the top right, log in, access the “Segreteria” option and then click on the “Pagamenti” item and select the invoice number to make the payment using the aforementioned PagoPA procedure. No other forms of payment are allowed. (The payment is

accepted automatically and the outcome is available in the reserved area - Segreteria / Pagamenti - after about 3-4 days).

- **International students** shall pay by **credit card** using the PagoPA payment procedure automatically generated by the system at the end of the application submission for selection admission according to the following procedure: [www.uniroma4.it](http://www.uniroma4.it) – Icon user on the top right, click on "Accesso Studenti e Docenti", log in, select Segreteria and then click on Payments and select the invoice number to proceed with the online payment (only by credit card) or by bank transfer to the university bank account: Università degli Studi di Roma "Foro Italico", IBAN IT92B0569603215000004910X56; BIC/SWIFT POSOIT22XXX, Banca Popolare di Sondrio, then **sending electronic copy** of the relevant receipt to [concorsi.ammissione@uniroma4.it](mailto:concorsi.ammissione@uniroma4.it).

**Failure to pay by the deadline will result in exclusion from selection procedures. The selection fee shall not be reimbursed under any circumstances.**

Students from partner universities are subject to local rules.

### **SELECTION RESULTS**

Results of the selection process (PROVISIONAL ranking list) will be announced on **28 July 2025** exclusively through their publication of a specific notice on the websites: [www.uniroma4.it](http://www.uniroma4.it) as well as on websites of the consortium Universities.

### **NON-EU STUDENTS**

**Non-EU citizens not residing in Italy** have been reserved **5** positions. Without prejudice to the selection procedures of the current Call, applications for the admission and selection tests must observe Italian Ministry of Universities and Research's regulations (*Procedure per l'ingresso, il soggiorno e l'immatricolazione degli studenti stranieri/internazionali ai corsi della formazione superiore in Italia per l'anno accademico 2024-2025*). The procedures are available in the University Portal at <https://www.universitaly.it/studenti-stranieri>, that will represent the unique official tool, both for the promotion of the Italian academic educational offer and for the online pre-enrollment of foreign/international students.

No quota limits apply for EU-candidates, wherever residing, and non-EU candidates meeting requirements of art. 39, paragraph V, of legislative decree of 25.07.1998 nr 286 (legally staying in Italy) who can be admitted to selection tests as long as they are in possession of a valid qualification.

### **ENROLMENT**

Successful candidates that have been admitted through the ranking list and up to set positions, shall enroll by the deadline that will be communicated afterwards the publication of the FINAL ranking. Successful candidates who will not enroll by deadline and according to enrolment procedures, will automatically be considered dropouts. Thus, up to set positions, through online announcement, we will proceed with the ranking list. Students from consortium universities, with the exception of Italian students, are allowed to pay taxes and contributions of the two-year course on the basis of a fixed amount, without calculation of family income (I.S.E.E.). The set amount is Euro 3.200,00 (Euro 1.600,00/year) (Board of Directors' deliberation of 08/06/2017). For the A.Y. 2025-2026, the 1<sup>st</sup> instalment fee is € 156,00, the 2<sup>nd</sup> instalment fee is € 722,00 and the 3<sup>rd</sup> instalment fee is € 722,00.

The first two (2) best students from each partner university, up to a maximum of ten (10) students, are fully exempted every year from the comprehensive contribution and they have to pay only the DSU regional tax (€ 140,00) plus Virtual duty stamp (€ 16,00) provided they comply with the following merit requirements:

- a) 1<sup>st</sup> year: acquirement of 30 ECTS by the end of the first semester;
- b) 2<sup>nd</sup> year: acquirement of 75 ECTS by the end of the first semester;

The amount of student contribution for a.y. 2025-2026 is set by the [REGOLAMENTO TASSE E CONTRIBUTI A CARICO DEGLI STUDENTI](#) of the University, summarized below:

1<sup>st</sup> enrolment installment (DSU Regional Tax € 140,00 + Virtual Stamp Duty: € 16,00) to be paid by the deadline that will be communicated next.

2<sup>nd</sup> enrolment installment (50% of the comprehensive contribution) to be paid approximately by 15-20 of December 2025.

3<sup>rd</sup> enrolment installment (50% of the comprehensive contribution) to be paid approximately by the end of April 2026.

Please, note: the actual deadlines for the above mentioned payments will be included at due time in the enrolment notice.

Students enroll as non-regular ("Fuori Corso") if, within the Master programme time period set in the course regulations, they have not yet earned all the university credits required to obtain the degree. From the 2<sup>nd</sup> to 5<sup>th</sup> year as non-regular student, the minimum and maximum amount of student contribution increase by 20%, 30%, 40%, 50% respectively. From the 5<sup>th</sup> year of non-regular enrolment onwards, the increase is 50%.

**Total and partial exemption from comprehensive contribution:**

Disabled students with an attested disability (art.3, par.1 and 3, of legislative decree of n.104/1992) or an attested disability up to or exceeding 66%, are completely exempted from the comprehensive contribution except for the stamp duty (€ 16,00) to be paid by the 1<sup>st</sup> instalment deadline. Students with a disability between 33% and 65% are offered a partial exemption from contributions of € 300,00. Interested applicants are invited to send the relevant certifications to [tutorato.specializzato@uniroma4.it](mailto:tutorato.specializzato@uniroma4.it)

**SIMULTANEOUS ENROLMENT IN 2 COURSES OF STUDY**

A student can be simultaneously enrolled in two higher education courses as provided for by Law No. 33 of April 12, 2022 and Ministerial Decrees No. 930 of July 29, 2022 (Provisions to allow simultaneous enrollment in two university courses) and No. 933 of August 2, 2022 (Provisions to allow simultaneous enrollment in two AFAM courses or one AFAM course and one university course). Applicants already enrolled at another university or AFAM who wish to take advantage of dual enrollment should submit their request by the deadline of the call for applications via e-mail to [concorsi.ammissione@uniroma4.it](mailto:concorsi.ammissione@uniroma4.it) using the form attached to this call. The request must be accompanied by the study plan of the course in which they are enrolled.

**RIGHT TO UNIVERSITY STUDIES**
